Answers are on the bottom of the page.



MAKE IT!

AFIKOMEN BAG

Finding the *afikomen* is one of the most fun parts of the Seder. But you can make your own bag to hide it in!



- 1 Find an old pillowcase that isn't being used anymore (ask first, and make sure it's clean!).
- 2 Cut it in half, in line with the short side, so it's only half as wide but still forms a pocket.

- 3 Now, decorate it! Color it with paints and markers... glue on different-colored buttons, ribbons or sequins...tie-dye it...whatever you like! You can even write "Afikomen Bag" on it or just "Find Me!" Here is the word "*afikomen*" in Hebrew:

אפיקומן



At the Seder, make sure whoever is hiding the *afikomen* uses your special bag.



HAVE YOU EVER HAD A... CHOCOLATE SEDER?

This is a way to practice for your Seder... It's like a regular Seder, except everything is chocolate! Including...

- Chocolate-covered matzah
- A chocolate Seder plate
- Four Cups... of chocolate milk!
- Bitter herbs? No, bittersweet chocolate!
- "Charoset" = chocolate pudding + chocolate chips
- For the Hillel sandwich? Matzah s'mores!

You can practice dipping by dipping fruit into chocolate syrup. For the rest of the Seder plate, the "bone" could be a chocolate-covered pretzel stick, and there are chocolate eggs. And if you can't find chocolate frogs, there is a kind of chocolate candy called "turtles" (careful, these have nuts!)
